FAQs for Parents/Carers, Children, and Our Community About Joining a Multi-Academy Trust (MAT)

We are excited to share information about our school's decision to create a Multi-Academy Trust (MAT), a step that will enhance the educational experience for our children while preserving the values and community spirit we hold dear. Below, we've answered your key questions to help you understand what this means for your child and our school.

What is a MAT?

A MAT is a group of schools that work together as a single organisation. This allows us to share resources, expertise, and best practices, ultimately providing a better education for all our children.

Why are we joining a MAT?

Will staff change as a result of joining the MAT?

Will there be any new costs for parents?

Will the school still follow the National Curriculum?

Will the school still work with the local community?

Will my child have to move to another school?

No, your child will remain in their current school.

Will term dates change?

Will there be any change to Special Educational Needs & Disabilities (SEND) support?

No, SEND support will continue and potentially be enhanced through the MAT's network of resources and expertise.

How will the MAT support my child's wellbeing and mental health?

The MAT will provide access to a wider network of expertise, including specialists in mental health and wellbeing. This means we can enhance our existing support systems, offering more resources and programs to ensure your child's emotional and social needs are met.

Will my child interact with children from other schools in the MAT?
